PRESIDENT'S REPORT JULY 2019 - JUNE 2020







The end of an unusual club year. Covid has taken its toll on all of us, some in more ways than others. For the club it curtailed our season very early with no diving and new memberships from late March until June. The Rottnest week fortunately completed just days before restrictions came into place, culminating in the closure of the island and surrounding waters.


Despite the Covid set back in revenue from membership and dive bookings (down \$6k), and an expensive year for boat maintenance (up \$12k), we had a very small operating surplus. With depreciation on the boat added in we made

a deficit for the year of almost \$8k. Despite this, the club remains in a healthy financial position, and given these difficult economic times, the committee decided on no increase in membership and diving fees.









Thanks again to Steve Day, who works tirelessly in the background keeping the books up to date. It's no mean feat keeping on top of everything and he has now been doing the role since 2012.

Thanks also to Wendy Hutchison for her hard work in managing the day to day correspondence, meeting agendas and minutes and general club business. Her attention to detail and the high standard to which she does everything makes all our jobs so much easier. She will be standing down from the committee this year and will be missed by all.

On the social side Liz Davey organised another great Xmas party back at the Type One Telethon Centre (thanks yet again to Bec for helping on this). We decided to move the Australia Day firework boat trip back to the city as Rockingham can be a bit exposed to the elements. I think everyone who went on it would say it was an outstanding success and thanks again to Liz for organising and Chris and Wendy for crewing.

On the topics of social get togethers, we gave up with the bimonthly club meetings as again we had a very poor attendance. We will continue to hold a quarterly get together for the AGM (August), a social, probably on the boat in October, the Xmas party and another social in March. I'm sure there

will be other events such as the Australia Day boat trip and the Christmas Orphans dive. Of course, members are more than welcome to organise any social events outside of these four meetings and if you would like to organise something please get in touch with Liz, our social coordinator.

The boat thankfully has been running well with only a couple of technical issues with the engine control system and of course a fairly significant repair to fix a leaking fuel tank. Again, a big thanks to Chris Cunnold who put in so much time to keep it ship shape and running smoothly. Chris handed the



reigns over to committee newbie Jonathan Anderson in May after almost two years in the job. In between Steve D stepped into the breach to organise the boat lifting, fuel tank repair and antifouling to which we had an outstanding response in offers to help, including a good few newer faces.

Donna Gratton took over the reigns as dive coordinator from Mel Turner (always going to be a hard act to follow) and has done a fantastic job both in the regular weekly arrangements but in also arranging a good few specials, including a Rotto weekend, a Mindarie weekend and an Abrolhos trip. All proved extremely popular showing a good demand for dive trips outside the regular weekends.



On safety Pete Northrop has maintaining our vigilance in safety and this year I think has seen the fewest incidents that I can recall. Steve Zoccoli did a great job updating our website with a fresh and contemporary look and introduced the new booking system including an option to pay by credit card. Meanwhile Jazz tried hard to get some club enthusiasm for the environment but struggled with the ongoing issue of member apathy with poor attendance at a number of events.

We welcomed two new committee members during this year, Tom Bassett taking over as Vice President and Jonathan Anderson taking over as Boat Officer from Chris who covered both roles. Tom is a long serving club member and has held the position of Vice President in the past. Its great to see him back and always great to see a new face on the committee in Jonathan, our Boat Officer.



The club is also now welcoming free divers on board following discussions between the committee and Helen Alison, culminating in a boat trial at Nurses Quarters in January with Helen and Tania Douthwaite. Like our Scuba divers, this of course subject to the free divers holding the appropriate qualifications and always buddy diving.

Finally, a huge thanks to the crew, the Dive Officers and Skippers that make the club work. Without them the boat would sit in the pen going nowhere.

It is a continual battle to maintain numbers, particularly of Dive Officers and we have seen a high turnover these last few years. Many of our divers seem to forget that the crew are all volunteers and we always welcome a helping hand, particularly at the end of a long day when the boat is put to bed. If any club member would like to train up as a Dive Officer then please let me know. It only takes a commitment of about once every six weeks and does come with the benefit of free diving as long as you are on the roster.

Here's to a better 2020-21 club year and may we all remain healthy and lockdown free.

TREASURER'S REPORT JULY 2019 - JUNE 2020

Phew! who will ever forget 2020, the year the Covid-19 pandemic struck our world. One minute we are all going about our busy lives the next those lives were turned on their heads. All I can say is thank goodness for the new social media applications which has allowed work from home and contact with loved ones where the physical was not permitted.

I am grateful our State Government locked down our borders to allow us to enjoy the relative freedom, at the time of writing tis, we currently enjoy.

I can report that our Club's deficit for 19/20 was \$7,845. This included a non-cash depreciation charge of \$8,829.

Unsurprisingly Covid19 impacted the Club's 2020 results in that diving income for the March-June quarter fell some 62%. Nomination dive income fell 76% for the same period.

We can be grateful that the annual Rottnest trip scraped in before the Covid lockdown. Not so lucky was the May annual Reef Life Survey trip which did not proceed.

A major contribution to our deficit was boat costs which increased 149% this year. We had some troublesome engine niggles which thanks to Chris Cunnold were finally diagnosed and fixed.

Despite the increase in costs and decrease in income we managed to grow the Ing's cash deposit fund by 1% and pleasingly membership income fell by just 5% for the year.

A big thanks this year for the efforts of Donna Gratton who admirably filled the shoes of Mel Turner as our Dive Coordinator. Her hard work was recognised and rewarded at our Christmas function by being presented with the Club Person Trophy.

Liz Davey pulled through again this year by running a very successful annual Rottnest trip so well-done Liz.

Apart from those mentioned above I would also like to record my appreciation to the other Committee persons, namely, Mike, Wendy, Peter, Steve Z and Jazz.

Also, a big thanks to Paul Burns and Gurmit Singh for again auditing the club's books.

Given the lockdowns in place plus the international travel bans I can see this year will be a bumper dive year for our club.

I intend to renominate as your Treasurer.

BOAT OFFICER AND MARINA LIAISON REPORT JULY 2019 – JUNE 2020





Chris resigned from the position at the end of April and Steve Day took over care holder of the position for the month of May. I took over during June and I am still trying to find my feet. I am very grateful to Steve and Chris for taking care of the vessel refit in May as there was a substantial amount of work complete during the dry dock. I also want to say thanks to Mike and all other members who were involved in the work during that time.

Activities during the refit in May:

- Hull cleaned and 2 coats of antifouling paint applied (12 L of paint)
- Keel anodes replaced
- Propeller shaft anode replaced
- Propeller cleaned and shined
- Rudder shaft and tiller arm greased
- 2 x primary and 1 secondary fuel filters replaced
- Water inlet grill cleaned
- Fuel tank leak repaired
- Reversed anchor chain
- New anchor swivel
- New blue paint on transom.

Activities which require my attention:

- 1. Steve currently has spare parts for the vessel stored at his place. Need a place to store these parts
- 2. Get quotes and get ladder repaired
- 3. Determine the remaining life in the battery banks and prepare cost estimate
- 4. Put together a maintenance spreadsheet (of sorts)
- 5. Need to find possible stand in (subcommittee) for times when I am out of town.




MEMBERSHIP REPORT JULY 2019 – JUNE 2020






Membership numbers for 2019-20 club year were pretty much the same at 115 as the previous year, which given the fact that Covid effectively halted new memberships from March until the end of the club year, was a better than expected outcome. Diving members (i.e. members who dive as opposed to social members) continued the downward trend seen over the last few years but I suspect if not for Covid we would have reversed that trend this year. Oh well.... here's to next year. May it be less traumatic than this one.


A continuing interesting trend on the chart below is the % of nomination divers joining the club. For the last two years we have had close to 100% join. Why? Well as before, I think because nomination divers are AOW they are more experienced and dedicated and therefore more go onto to join the club. Fewer 'fly by nighters' if you like.



Total membership was pretty much in line with the two previous years despite the Covid set back, finishing at 115 members. However we did see a small drop in the number of diving members to 83, which in turn usually means a drop in diving revenue.




Every year we turn over between 20 and 30 members and this past year was broadly in line with previous years with 24 new members joining. New members are a critical component for the club as not only do they bring in membership fees, but they generally make up the majority of the divers on the boat and thus are critical in keeping boat dive numbers up. As the majority of club income comes from membership fees and diving revenue, its critical that both these are maintained for a healthy club. We can all play a part in that process by publicizing the club and inviting along diving friends and family.



Finally the chart below I think shows a concerning trend. The lines represent the cumulative diver count as we go through each years boat dives. The darker the line the more recent the data with

the bottom most line the result for 2019-20. Even without Covid you can see we were trending well below the previous years in terms of number of divers on the boat. As this directly equates to revenue to the club it is a downward trend we cannot sustain for too long. The fewer divers on the boat the more we will need to increase dive fees to pay the running costs which in turn leads to fewer divers. A dangerous spiral to get into.



To this end we all must play our part if we want the UEC to last another 60 years


