






Presidents Report - Mike Buchanan




- A record year for lots of reasons (since recent records began c2011)
 - Memberships at all time high of 152 (YTD 31st May)
 - Record number of boat trips in a year at 60 (YTD 6th June)
 - Record number of boat dives in a year at 1135 (YTD 6th June)
 - Record operating surplus at \$39,416 driven by higher memberships and boat dives (YTD 31st May)
 - Highest number of Skipper and Dive Officer trainees in a year
 - Highest number of club trips, both state and overseas
- Professional boat maintenance plan now in place ensuring we protect our main asset and income source
- No safety incidents of note to report
- A big thanks to all our committee and crew for making all this possible









Operating Surplus

Bank Account Deposits




Membership Report—Alice Henderson


- This year, we have reached a record Membership level with 152 active members. This surpasses our previous record of 129 set in FY16-17.
- We have experienced the highest number of Enquiries, the highest number of Nomination Dives, and the highest number of New Members on record



- We have also had the lowest number in 10 years of Members not renewing
- The diversity of our Members is increasing, with 30% Female

Treasurer's Report – Jean Francois Leuenberger



Amazing year for UEC, a constant monthly surplus reaching close to \$40,000.00 at the end of May, a record number of membership and a full boat nearly every week end.

The Club has also organised a wonderful number of dive trips and events this year E.G; The Lena, HMAS Perth, the Blade, Augusta, Coco's Islands, Rottnest pilgrimage and recently The Abrolhos all contributed to this record surplus. And our contribution to the Rottnest Swim in February.

These funds give us with the opportunity to spend around \$20K in June to service and maintain the boat while keeping the membership and dive cost down for 2022-2023.

Thank you to the hard working committee, to the skippers and Diving Officers for making the diving possible each week. Thank you all for your support, you are part of a fantastic Club.

What another year gone!


- We can be proud to say we managed to do three Underwater Clean Ups[©]

- Thanks to the committee and clubs members for their support!




