Pirate Pete's Safety Tips

How To Be A Good Dive Buddy

Most people find that the best things in life are even better when shared with someone. So it is with diving. While we firmly believe all divers should be able to take care of themselves in and out of the water, we also believe the buddy system is a critical aspect of scuba diving safety. From monitoring equipment and skills to providing support in case of emergencies, a good buddy is invaluable. And like other relationships in your life, it takes work to make the buddy partnership a good one. Here are our tips.

Using the buddy system is key for safe scuba diving, but it takes independent effort to be a good buddy.

Speak the Same Language

Planning a dive is more than mapping out your basic profile. A buddy team should decide who will lead the dive, review hand signals and discuss emergency procedures, such as what to do if you get separated and you should have the conversation before putting a fin in the water. Hand signals are the most common way to "talk" to your buddy once you've begun a dive. If your buddy is new, asking if he or she is OK by flashing the universal OK hand signal can be a reassuring way to let him or her know you're paying attention. Ditto for asking your buddy how much air he or she has remaining.

Beyond hand signals, buddies communicate by staying close and making eye contact. We can tell a lot by expressions, breathing patterns and body postures, often unconsciously. The more you dive with someone, the more you learn each other's language.

Saturday 27th January Exploratory Diving Day Skipper - Mike The relationship that long time buddies develop results in a kind of mental muscle memory that dictates who leads and who follows, and allows for communicating changes in the dive plan that need to be made on the fly due to unforeseen circumstances.

Not every underwater conversation can be conducted with a simple hand signal or by glancing at your buddy.

Flashlights, camera lights or glow sticks are not only good for night dives, but they also work well on reefs to point out wildlife or get your buddy to look in your direction.

If you find that you need to stop the dive because your buddy is puzzled by what you're trying to tell him or her, make sure you've got some way to scribble a message. A good set of wet notes or a slate is a must on every dive, regardless of unspoken communication skills.

Getting your buddy's attention can be tough when there's a shark cruising past or he's preoccupied with the settings on his camera. Carry some sort of audible device, so if your buddy isn't looking in your direction, you can still get his or her attention.

Wet Behind the Ears?

Your buddy maybe a spouse, friend or fellow dive-club member. You know each other's level of comfort in the water, experience and skills, goals for the dive and you may have perhaps made the same dive together countless times. Even when a dive doesn't go as planned, neither one feels pressure to push your limits and neither one feels badly for making the other one miss out on a dive that you might not be comfortable doing.

That's in a perfect world, one in which you and your buddy share attributes that match, but we divers know that's not always possible.

One of the remarkable things about diving is that it's one of the few activities in which a very experienced person and a very inexperienced person can participate together and both really enjoy it. But the more experienced and qualified diver needs to respect the less experienced diver's limits. Failing to do so at best can take the fun out of the dive, and at worst can lead to an accident. Make sure you and your buddy discuss limitations or issues that could affect how you plan the dive. Respect limits and both divers can have a great time.

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<u>New Membership, Nomination,</u> <u>Affiliate & Liability Forms</u> Pairing up with a buddy who runs out of air while you still have half a tank can be annoying.

Like skill level and experience, similar air-consumption and swimming rates will lead to a more-relaxed dive, but it's not crucial as long as you communicate. A good buddy team knows what to expect from each other, including gas use, and they check gas together routinely.

What about the speed-demon buddy? Diving is just like going out to dinner with a friend and it makes it difficult when one person is a vegetarian and the other only wants steak. Diving is something we all do to enjoy ourselves and see things that interest us. Signal your buddy to slow down and stay together.

Of course, fining along at a nudibranch's pace can also pose issues. If you're a photographer and your buddy isn't, lingering too long in one spot can also be a problem for the buddy who's hanging around waiting for you to take the perfect photo. When it comes to pace, some buddies just may not be compatible. Be honest, and find a new buddy if that's the case.

The Bottom Line

In the end it comes down to trust. The buddies you can trust are those who stay close and communicate They stick to the plan. They're not afraid to call a dive if they think it's necessary, and they don't argue if the other does. They stay at hand when the other is task focused, even though for the moment, all they're doing is essentially watching the other. It's clear they have each other's backs.

Weekly Diving

Last week's diving MUD Scientific Dive



On Saturday we headed out on a MUD Scientific Dive, with Carl as the Skipper and myself as DO. Initially we had 13 divers booked on but after a flurry of cancellations

the day before, we were down to 6 keen divers by Saturday morning.

After the usual boat briefing and then an additional briefing on the sciencey stuff by MUD Leader Ian, we were off to the seagrass beds at Southern Flats. It was a breezy morning but our site was nicely sheltered from the wind.

There were three sites at Southern Flats that the MUD team wanted to count, but unfortunately they were all in 1.2-1.5m of water. So we dropped anchor as close to the site as comfortable, and then used the tender (and Ian's portable GPS) to ferry dive flags and divers on each of the 3 sites. The divers then spent 2 whole hours counting blades of seagrass and recording any marine animals living in the seagrass. Meanwhile (back on the boat), Carl and I threw a couple of jigs in and managed to catch a nice feed of squid (well – Carl did, I only caught one).

Once done, the divers gave us the pick-up signal and it was back out to each of the sites where we loaded gear and divers in, and ferried them back to Cape Cruiser. It was quickly decided that they had counted enough sea grass for one day, and a fun dive was sounding very appealing. Given the conditions (the wind had picked up) – we decided to dive the D9. We found the site, dropped anchor, got everything ready to dive – and then looked at

the shot-line, which was indicating a ripping current. After a fair bit of chin scratching it was decided this wasn't a good idea, and we would give the dive a miss. So back to Coogee we went.

It was a great bunch of divers who came along, and Ian did a great job of organising and running the activities – thanks to all on board for an absolute pleasure of a day. And a special thanks to Jemma, David, Mark and Ian for helping us get in and out of the pen.



Sunday – Rogers Rock & The Archways (Jackson Rock) Cape Cruiser was back out again on Sunday – this time with Steve at the helm, myself as DO and Chris McCoppin continuing his DO Training. Steve had called an early start and we had all ten divers loaded on to the boat ready to go by 7.30am.

We headed to our first scheduled site – Rogers Rock. From all reports it sounded like it was much nicer under water than above, with vis around 20m and not too much surge to contend with. Divers also really enjoyed the topography of the site, and there were 6 crays brought up on board – 4 by David, and 2 by James.

We had some difficulty getting the anchor up and were about to send divers in to retrieve it when we decided to give it one final, last, "just-in-case" go... it came up! (YAY!) So off we motored the short distance to our next site – The Archways (Jackson Rock).

During this dive the wind started picking up and it became a lot rougher on the surface. Divers reported similar conditions underwater (except the vis was more like 10-15m on this dive), and a slight current that picked up as the dive progressed. This time Geoff brought 4 crays on board, bringing the boat total to 10. We did have a couple of divers surface a distance from the boat, but thanks to their safety sausages they were easily spotted and picked up commendably by Trainee DO Chris. Once all on board, it was time to head back to Coogee. Given the conditions, it was quite a comfortable ride home thanks to some skilful Skippering by Steve.... an enjoyable and adventurous day out on Cape Cruiser! Thanks to everyone who came along, and special thanks to Mike and Geoff for their help in penning the boat at the end of the day.

The Carlisle Castle (1899)

The club was fortunate to have great conditions on Saturday for our trip to the Rockingham area. Skipper Chris made a great call to visit the Carlisle Castle and we all had a fantastic dive.



The *Carlisle Castle* was was a fully rigged iron hulled barque, built in London one hundred and fifty years ago in 1868. She sailed from Glasgow with a cargo of rail lines and other general cargo and was due to arrive in Fremantle in July 1899. On July 11th a force 10 Westerly storm swept through the area creating treacherous conditions. Popular belief is that with such a heavy load the ship sunk immediately on contact with the Coventry Reef, and the crew of twenty two men went down with the ship. The *City of York*, on a voyage from San Francisco to Fremantle carrying timber cargo, was wrecked during the same storm with the loss of eleven lives.

FULL LIST OF THE CREW.

A complete list of the crew of the barque Carlisle Castle, which was wrecked off Rockingham at the beginning of last month, has at length come to hand. Yesterday Captain T. W. Smith, shipping master at Fremantle, received a copy of the Glasgow Weekly Herald, dated July 22nd, in which the names of the crew who sailed from Liverpool in the ill-fated vessel are published. From her size and class it was thought that the Carlisle Castle had a crew of about 26 on board, but it turns out that she carried 22 only, all told. The number is much below the average for a barque like the Carlisle Castle, but it is accounted for by the fact that no apprentices were on board, all the crew, with the exception of the officers, being able seamen.

The master, the report goes on to state, was about 50 years of age, and a native of Aberdeen. It was his first voyage on the Carlisle Castle, but he had sailed to Australia for a number of years. Formerly he was in the employment of Messrs. Trinder, Anderson and Co., London, and had the reputation of being a most experienced navigator, and in social life he was highly respected. He leaves a widow, who lives at Forest Gate, but no children. Fredrick Houston, the first mate, belongs to St. Albans. It was also his first voyage on the Carlisle Castle. Edward Stocks, the steward, and William Yexley, the cook, both belonged to London. They had been some years in the Carlisle Castle, and Captain Robertson, the owner of the vessel, says they were most faithful servants.' The A.B.'s are composed of Englishmen, Scotsmen, and Norwegians. With the exception of German and Jamieson, who were shipped at Greenock, they were all shipped at Glasgow. German and Jamieson were shipping because two of the original crew for some reason or other did not put in an appearance up till the time the Carlisle Castle left Glasgow.

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




Weekly Diving

Last week's diving Saturday

out on CC in light easterly winds and low swell to Coventry Reef to dive the Carlisle Castle wreck and surrounding reef. After anchoring the divers geared up and entered the water. About 50 minutes later they began to return, talking of a 12m dive with 15-20m vis but a bit of surge. Lots of fish were sighted and many overhangs entered and





holes checked resulting in 9 crays oming on board. A number of divers found the wreck seeing its anchor, bow, ribs and some of the iron cargo. It has been down since 1899! There were also 3 free divers around the reef and a number of nearby boats fishing, although it unknown if they got any fish.



We then motored towards Penguin Island with the breeze changing to south then south west and starting to pick up. After anchoring in a semi circle of reef, the divers entered the water for mostly around a 60 odd minute dive. The water was a bit shallower here, around 8m and vis was down to around 5m or so, still with some surge. Dave and Andrea entered a large overhang and swan with and watch a large school of buff bream circling them for some time. 10 further crays were brought on board. There were lots of caves and overhangs in the reef complex.

All the divers appeared to have had two good dives and enjoyed the day.

The wind and sea state continued to get up on the return trip to Coogee.

Sunday we headed out to Carl's Secret Spots for the hunt for some Cray. Under Carl's guidance Wendy got us to Carl's Secret Spot #1. The conditions on the surface were perfect for diving and the water looked clean and clear. It was this stage Wendy & I were both very envious we were not diving.

The site was relative shallow so divers had plenty of time to go out and hunt for crays. After an hour or so we had all divers back however we only manage to get 5 crays. Bec made it back to the boat early with not one but two monster jumbo crays! and shortly after the other divers followed. This site was like cray gold, with all divers bagging out and reaching the boat limit for the day.

We had a great bunch of divers on board and great diving conditions to top it off. Thank you to Georgina & Tristan for coming out and trying out the boat, hope to see you both on the boat again soon.

We had a couple of bites at pulling the pick due to the chain running around a Bombie but the water was clear and shallow enough that we could see the chain from the surface and just drove the boat around the rock to free it up.

Then it was a simple, if bumpy, trip back to harbour for an early finish. Everyone happy, no one dead and thanks to Mel for helping us put the boat to bed!

The fantastic thing about squidding is – even those of us with no talent for it can catch one of these things... you just have to have a line in the water. I was solid proof of this – after chucking my line in, I decided to go have a drink/wee/bite to eat/chat. 5min later I returned to my very bent over rod, and I figured I'd caught me a piece of seaweed. No – there was a stonker of a squid on the end of it! I put that one down to the lucky jig I found on a night dive the Thursday night prior...

So this continued for some time – we'd motor back out to the seaweed patches, motor goes off, lines go in, we drift and pull up a squid or two, then repeat the process. It was a lot of fun!

Once our bellies were full it was back out to sea again, but this time we floated further south (between Bathers Beach and Coogee). We hit a patch of big squiddies here and so a few more were brought on board, as well as a nice cuttlefish by John!

The day was a roaring success, with plenty of comments like "when can we do this again?" and "why hadn't I booked on to one of these days earlier – that was SO MUCH fun!"



Crays seemed a bit thin on the ground, then found four, bagged one, missed the next in line (there was a hole in my loop), missed his mate (I slipped on a Banana Prawn) then found, in a little cave, a jumbo that I had dead to rights and managed to miss him (my wrist misfired when I pulled the trigger, the sun was in my eyes, a Bull Ray got in my way and my fins missed a gear).

I cast around empty handed for most of the dive, ready to give up, when I found three in a little, well-lit archway on the sand. Got one and the other two tried to hide in shallow rock depressions with nowhere to go, presumably hoping that I was blind. Sadly, for them, I just reached in and uprooted them for a nice little boat trip.

So back with six, while Damo bagged out with eight for the day and Richard came in with a very good showing of three for his first catch day. Seventeen for the day so Carl was a bit miffed that he wasn't keeping up his boat record but not bad for three fishers!

Up anchor with no issues, got a few hundred litres of motion lotion for the boat and back to the pen! Great day had by all

Well the dive times varied from 20min to an hour – with reports of the vis being 5m in holes that gave some protection from the surge, 2m outside of these holes. Despite this, divers did actually enjoy the site... there was the usual Bull Rays hanging about, and reports of "I saw... fish!" Always nice to hear in the ocean! Craydrian lived up to his reputation bringing back 6 and Bernie also bagged a keeper.

We decided to shelter in Geordie Bay for lunch and the surface interval. The wind had dropped during the first dive, and so it was more pleasant after our little sojourn in Geordie. We decided on Geordie Bay caves for the second dive, with 4 of our 7 divers jumping in for this one. Reports were the vis was even worse on this dive – around 0.5m (and I think our divers were being polite). But despite the pea soup-like conditions, these brave, hardy souls took us up on our offer of an extended dive time, smashing out dive times of 60-70min... I don't think I've ever been so impressed in my life.



Jeff W turned up on a pretty chilly and breezy morning to go looking for sharks.

We set off with Nurses Quarters as our destination. Seas were more lumpy than expected with a stiff SE breeze blowing. After what seemed a long journey we arrived and dropped the anchor and with the some trepidation we watched the drop line flag to see what the current was like. It was there with the flag flying at 45 deg but deemed just diveable. After a quick dive briefing where we reiterated "go to the anchor, the dive site is at the anchor NOT at the back of the boat" we all jumped in.

Sure enough the anchor was sitting pretty right at the left hand side of the shark cave. Viz was pretty crappy and the current had made it a bit of a swim to get there but we were treated to about five to seven sharks in residence (due to the crappy viz it was difficult to get an exact number).



After watching them for a wee while I decided to go and try to find the double decker cave, which according to both Malcolm and Adrian was just to the left of the wormhole. Finding the wormhole was no problem and a quick poke of the head into the tunnel made me decide that the current and surge was just a bit too much to risk swimming through so it was off to find the cave. Well I swam around the area two or three times, through some lovely small caves and gullies, coming across the occasional Shark, who had obviously tired of the attention but no cave that matched the description. With air running low it was time to head for the boat. dive; you must be a financial member to dive (before you book on - no paying on the boat) and have no outstanding dive fees (you can pay cash on the boat to clear these)

- Dive fees are \$75 per double dive trip (even if you only do one dive) and \$45 for a single dive trip

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

There is nothing to beat swimming round in circles to screw up the sense of direction so after swimming towards what I thought was the anchor location, I eventually surfaced to find I had overshot by about 200m. A quick bearing check then back down. Swam the 200m but no boat so back up to the surface. Here is the lesson for me. If you have a strong current flowing from your side then when you swim a bearing you need to take it into account. I ended up the right distance but about 30m behind the mermaid line so it was a hard swim into the current to catch the line. If I thought it was a hard swim poor Adrian had it even harder as I caught the rope on my leg and as I pulled myself to the boat I kept pulling the buoy out of his reach.



Back on board and yes there were some who didn't find the cave and the sharks. You can lead a horse to water.....



For the second dive, after a (very) quick discussion, the







'skipper' wisely decided against Parker Point Drop Off and we headed for Crystal Palace/The Vault. Again the anchor was right on the mark, in fact I had to pull the chain out of the cave but we still had divers who didn't find it. A stunning dive along the scarp with back to back caves, and a couple of small Port Jacksons just to make it special before heading back to the boat.

The weather had finally caught up with the forecast and it was a nice flat run back to FBH for a refuel, coffee and ice cream before home to Coogee.

A big thanks to our wonderful crew of Steve, Bec and Jeff for a great day diving with the sharks.

Last Weeks Dive Reef Life Survey Annual Rottnest trip

It was an anxious week leading up to this year's event with a contingent of people booked to fly in from Tasmania and Victoria and the first big cold front of the season bearing down on Perth. Added pressure the 10th Anniversary of Reef Life Survey and there were celebrations planned. By Thursday the east-coasters had arrived and made it onto the last ferry to Rotto before they stopped for two days due to the weather. Sunday was still to rough for *Cape Cruiser* but having been through this a few times now and having added an extra day to the trip this year, the backup plan was beginning to be rolled out.

The Reef Life Survey Foundation (RLS) is based at the University of Tasmania and for the last ten years one of its main activity's has been to conduct nationwide underwater surveys using the same techniques, the same dates, the same dive sites and do it year after year to build robust sets of data encompassing diversity and numbers of fish life and invertebrates (slugs, shells etc.).

The work is funded by government and charity's and is nearly entirely carried out by volunteers - citizen scientists. After 10 years they have expanded internationally with teams in Spain and most recently Canada and close to 11,000 surveys completed in 53 countries. UEC has been involved in WA since 2011 when RLS became an affiliate of the UEC. They have used *Cape Cruiser* and a UEC crew for the last 7 Rottnest surveys and the enthusiasm is still building.

Calendar and Online Bookings

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We finally left Coogee at 7am on Monday; it was a cold and wet but there was a strong determination to get some key sites surveyed. For the maximum site coverage a couple of divers decided to give the boat dives a miss and do some sites from shore. The boat headed to Parakeet Bay where three RLS surveys sites are in close proximity and could all be done at the same time. The second dive at Crystal Palace was a challenge but everyone was in the water before there was time to ask " do you think this is a bit ?" They are a hardy lot of divers; only focussed on the job.



The job involves rolling out a 50 metre tape measure underwater, trying to get it as close to the same GPS point as possible each year. Two divers swim down each side of the tape counting fish, then returning to count invertebrates and a final sweep to photograph each quadrat (a couple if square metres) on both sides of the tape. The fish and "inverts" are counted and identified, with the names being recorded on a slate underwater using their scientific names. ١t must be interesting writing Coris auricularis or Glaucosoma hebraicum on an underwater slate while being rolled back and forth by 2 metre swell and then trying to decipher what you have written back in the research station after a few drinks.

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Still determined to get as many sites done as possible, Tuesday was an early start. The 7am departure challenged some of the team. A nice protected dive at Green Island followed by a not so protected one on Roe Reef saw the working part of the weekend over. Nine sites out of RLS's twenty three at Rotto were ticked off for the year. Some keen members had done 2 sites the weekend before so 11 sites in total was a good outcome when it had looked like none would be possible a week earlier.



Not enough to spend two days being pounded around on a boat and rolled around underwater, the activity's kicked on with a celebration of 10 years of RLS and 10 years of Rottnest surveys on Tuesday night at *Little Creatures* in Freo. There was recognition of some amazing individual volunteer efforts from across the country, some great gifts to recognise volunteer commitments and some very funny awards. A slide show of the achievements of the 10 years was very interesting and included the story of the unexpected and out of control media frenzy when RLS discovered a new population of Red Hand Fish in Tasmania, doubling the known population in the world to 70 specimens – and the 51 million Twitter hits this created.





Another successful RLS weekend over and plans for next year already underway.

A somewhat belated reminder that we have the June General Meeting tomorrow (Wednesday 20th June) at 7.30pm at the Esplanade Hotel Fremantle. Tables will be booked for dinner beforehand from 6pm onwards.

We have a special guest speaker, Kevin Edwards, who will be giving us a fascinating talk on the wreck of the VOC vessel Zeewijk

At 7pm on June 9, 1727, the Dutch East India Company (VOC) vessel Zeewijk struck Half Moon Reef, on the western side of the Pelsaert Group of the Houtman Abrolhos, some 60km off the coast of Western Australia.

Most of the crew subsequently made their way to what is today known as Gun Island. Here they remained for some 10 months, surviving on supplies retrieved from the wreck, and limited local resources such as muttonbirds and seals.

Ultimately, some 82 survivors managed to reach Batavia (Jakarta), in a small sloop that they had built themselves from salvaged timbers and mangrove wood.

In his talk, Kevin Edwards will provide an overview of the history and archaeology of Zeewijk's dramatic story. He'll also discus the various processes by which the current collection of archaeological material from Gun Island – housed in several Australian and international institutions – was assembled over the last 300 years.

Kevin Edwards graduated from UWA in 1991 and is currently a post-graduate student in the Maritime Archaeology program

at Flinders University. His research interests include: the archaeological potential of near and offshore disposals of military material (in wartime and post-bellum contexts), the application of social theory to shipwreck survivor camp studies, and the documentation of archaeological collections using a variety of 3D digitisation technologies. He hopes to expand his research to study the social and material agencies that influenced the creation of 19th century maritime archaeology museum collections.

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

It was a wonderfully cold morning when Steve and I turned up to break CC out of the ice and head out into the freezing dark (Ok, I may be exaggerating slightly.....it wasn't dark) for a single at South Mole Beacon Marker (Lyngern and Samuel Plimsoll wreck site) with three whole divers who hadn't checked the outside temperature before signing on.

It had been a while since being on deck so while Steve boned up on starting the engine and pointing the boat in the right direction, I tried to remember to which end of the boat I should strap the dinghy and why plugging the oars into the fuel line seemed to be more difficult than it should be.



Then it was off to the site at a slow cruise in nearly glassout conditions, anchored up and deposited three people in the water to rapidly refrigerate.



Condition to participate

Participants MUST be at the Hyperbaric Medicine Unit, Fiona Stanley Hospital, Murdoch, by 4.45 PM on Wednesday 12 September, to complete medical and waiver forms. Late arrivals will miss out. The dive will last about 30 minutes followed by 60 minute compulsory surface interval/talk by Doctor Fiona Sharpe on DCI and related matters. Doctor Fiona is a UEC member and hyperbaric doctor.

You must be a UEC member. You must be medically dive fit, to dive. You must be a certified diver and produce your certification card on the day. The lowest certification will determine the depth of the dive. As we are all Advanced Open Water or above it should be around 30-40m. Clothing on the day must be ALL COTTON. Synthetics and high pressure air does not mix. Static sparks from clothing is not good.

You should bring water, as it can get very hot in the chamber on descent, a bit cool on ascent for that matter. Drinks and nibbles can be brought in for consumption during the talk if you wish. You can bring your wrist mounted or puck type dive computer to record the dive. They drop it in a bucket of water for the dive.

Doctor Fiona and the technician who will drive the chamber on the day do this in their own time, so a small donation by participants to the units xmas fund is appreciated, \$5-10 each would be good. Donated on the day.

This is a fantastic opportunity and well worth making the effort to participate if you can.

The Hyperbaric Medicine Unit is located on the lower ground floor of the main hospital building. Parking is available at Fiona Stanley Hospital, in the carpark at a fee.

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

The light attracts the plankton and that attracts the Mantas. After about 15 mins I think we were all losing faith when suddenly out of the dark appeared a huge Manta. The next 30 minutes was the most spectacular show with these huge creatures flying over our heads close enough to touch.



The second night dive was with Nurse Sharks (very similar to our Wobbies). Similar set up, sitting on the sand with torches. A few squirts of some scent in the sand and it didn't take long before there were 10 or 15 large Nurse sharks cavorting around us. They were like puppies playing in front of us.



Of the day dives the highlights were the Whale Sharks and the Stingrays.



The Stingrays were the last dive of the trip and what a finale. We were dropped near a jetty where they dump the remains from the filleted Tuna. Sounds lovely I know but as you can imagine, if you dump a lot of food you attract a lot of fish. This was utter mayhem with Stingrays flying everywhere.



Of course there were lots of other great things to see, with Turtles, Clown fish, Scorpion fish. Eels and too many other things to mention.



Unfortunately all good things come to an end and so after what seemed like a flash we were back in Male harbour for the final group photo.



The one thing we all remarked on was the poor state of the

coral reef. The Maldives had a serious bleaching event in 2016 and the result is clear to see. If ever you needed a reminder of how fragile our marine environment is then this was it.

Save the Dolphins Dive (7th October)

The recent death of a female dolphin and her calf tangled in fishing line in the Swan River has prompted UEC-WA to join forces with Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) to help protect the rest of this small community.

UECWA is planning to coordinate two teams of divers to participate in an action to remove fishing line, hooks and lures from the pylons below the Canning and Garratt Road traffic bridges.

These two dives are scheduled for Sunday 7th October at 8am, which will fit in with the slack tide. Participants are asked to nominate either Canning Bridge or Garratt Road Bridge as their preferred location when registering.

The dive will be followed by a BBQ at Garratt Road Bridge Park, which will be kindly organised by the DBCA.

Please note that though the water is likely to be no more than a few meters deep, there may be current, low visibility, fishing line and other debris to contend with.



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

Save the Dolphins Dives - Canning and Garrett Road

<u>Bridges</u>

In response to the recent deaths of two dolphins which had been entangled in fishing line in the Swan River, UEC organised for a team of 18 divers to scour Canning and Garratt Road Bridges for fishing line and debris. Supporting the divers was a team of land based volunteers and paddlers that collected floating and other debris.

The Canning team found more fishing line than they could collect in the time they had. There was a lot there, including fishing line that had ended up being stretched between two pylons. You can imagine what damage that would do to a dolphin or other large species cruising through the murky waters.

The Garratt Road team found less fishing line but a lot more rubbish and debris from river users and people that see it as a dumping ground.

The most peculiar find of the day would definitely have to be the ammunition belt with ammo. This was closely followed by a small safe which later revealed a number of personal items. Both of these will be handed to the police.

The disappointing find of the day would be the catch all fishing nets at Canning Bridge, which are banned for use. Removing those from the river will go some way to protecting all species in an already heavily impacted estuary.

Thank you to everyone that participated in the day. It was great outcome. UEC would also like to thank the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions for helping organise the event and for the post event sausage sizzle.

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





First aid for sudden cardiac arrest

Did you know the club has a defibrillator (AED) on the boat? Would you know how to use it?

First aid for sudden cardiac arrest involves providing CPR and applying a defibrillator to the patient as soon as possible. A person's chance of survival decreases by 10% every minute that passes, so the sooner you can commence CPR and apply a defibrillator the better.

A number of people find the thought of using a defibrillator a scary one. If you're also feeling a bit uncertain, take a listen to St John paramedic, Brooke, as she explains how simple and safe defibrillators actually are to use.

Divers reported seeing Bull Rays, Cuttlefish, Crays (a few making it up to the boat) and LOADS of fish life.



During this dive Mike embarked on an ambitious underwater mission and headed straight to Nurse's Quarters, where he reported seeing 3 sharks in residence. Unfortunately for Mike he was swimming into the current on his return to the boat, and so needed a pick-up from a short distance away. 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

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

Last week's diving

Saturday saw we had 7 divers, two Trainee DO's (Jeff & Bernie), passenger (and all-around-helper) Chris, Skipper Wendy, and myself on board for what was shaping up to be a great Wreck Diving Day. It was to be Jeff's last run as a Trainee and so he was in charge of all the DO Duties (WOO HOO! Easy day for Mel!) He did a great job in putting Bernie, Chris and I to work and so we had the boat ready and at the loading jetty in no time.

After all our divers were on board and Jeff had given us the low-down in the boat briefing, we motored into glasslike conditions in the Sound, with the Sepia as our destination.

It was a quick ride there and before we knew it, the divers were jumping in. Interestingly, no cray loops made the jump either – a decision a few would come to regret.



Sepia Wreck 29th December 1898



'The Wreck of the Sepia—All hands Saved—A Thrilling Experience' (West Australian 31/12/1898)



The following is from the museum wreck database:

Sepia, a three-masted barque, was built by Denton, Grey and Company of Hartlepool and was owned by Bethell, Gwyn and Company, London. The vessel, well known as a trader on the Fremantle run, left London on 14 September 1898. Aboard were twelve crew and a mixed cargo of 1 200 tons valued at between £1 200 and £1 400.

Travelling at ten knots on the evening of 28 December, the Sepia ran before a strong southerly wind under the main and topgallant sails. Shipping was seen ahead of the vessel and this was presumed to be activity at the port of Fremantle. Captain Hugh Thomas was not new to navigation along this coast. Although no danger was anticipated, as the order was given to haul up, the barque struck a submerged rock without warning at the edge of Five Fathom Bank. The vessel sank in less than ten minutes. The speed at which the Sepia sank made the task of rescuing the crew difficult. Heavy seas were breaking Torch Camera Change of Clothes Sunnies Hat Suncream

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over the vessel and the cargo had begun to burst through the hatches. The loss of the vessel was said to have caused 'a considerable amount of inconvenience to the firms mentioned, they are depending in great measure upon her for their regular supplies'.

This site is considered the most complete iron-hulled vessel in the area containing a well-preserved cargo. The Sepia is representative of the vessels visiting Fremantle, and the types of cargo imported, in the late 19th century. The Sepia, built in 1864, is a relatively small vessel compared with contemporary sailers shipping to other interstate and overseas ports. Yet, as a regular visitor to Fremantle, it is typical of a late 19th century cargo ship, and analysis of its cargo is expected to provide new insight into the nature of colonial trade to Western Australia.

Day Trip to HMAS Swan (Dunsborough)

Last Saturday saw 6 keen Club Members meet up bright and early in Dunsborough, for a double dive on the HMAS Swan. It was a beautiful, sunny morning with barely a whisper of wind – we were pumped!

It's only a 20min ride to the site so in no time we were donning our BCD's and jumping in... the good news was, we could see the wreck from the surface (WOO!) We descended into stunning vis (20m), no surge or current, and sunshine lighting up the impressive wreck. Our first dive lasted for around 35min, and while we saw LOADS of fish life – the highlight was exploring the massive wreck in the stunningly clear water.



We were treated to a feast by Tracee (of Cape Dive) during our surface interval, during which time we had a few other boats turn up on the site. It was pretty clear that they and

their boatful's of fishing rods were disappointed we were there (it is a no-fishing zone but that rule clearly isn't observed – given the amount of fishing tackle on the wreck).



After a quick hour it was back in the water for our second dive – somehow the water felt a tad colder this time! Again, we were able to explore the wreck in stunning visibility. This time most of us took the opportunity to go and sit in the Captain's seat (in the Bridge) – always a bit of fun!



We had a strange experience on our safety stop – while we were all minding our own business, we witnessed two divers descending past us on hookah. Problem was – the young girl had clearly never been diving before, and was flapping about and trying to swim up, whilst her (also very young) companion ignored this and dragged her down. Oh, and did I mentioned – she had no fins on. Well, down she gets dragged (past the 20m mark) and in the process their hookah hoses manage to get tangled around some of us doing our stop – as well as the wreck below us. But never fear – Dad (or responsible Guardian) is watching this from the surface, and free dives down to untangle the hose from the wreck – while our divers continue to flap their way down the wreck. It was like watching a candidate for the Darwin Awards in front of our eyes... madness.

Eventually we had to leave them to it and ascend to the boat... despite the madness, it was an awesome dive – what a lucky day!

Last Weeks Diving

For Sunday's dive we had eight divers arrive slightly earlier than normal for Rogers Rock and The Archway. Due to the already slightly blowy conditions, and with the forecast for the wind to only increase, the decision was made to seek some shelter on the north side of the island.



So, with the wind from behind making the journey over quite pleasant we headed towards Roe Reef. No whales spotted this time, however Cape Cruiser was escorted for a short time by a small pod of dolphins that rode the wake, before jumping for joy as they peeled off to do whatever dolphins do on a Sunday morning.



Once we arrived at Rotto's Roe Reef, the eager divers dropped onto the ever reliable Victoria Station. With visibility at around 15m and very little swell or current to toss them around, everyone reported having a comfortable dive, though some believed that the water was cooler than the reported 19 degrees.

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The system of caves and swim thru's of Victoria Station saw big smiles rising from the ladder at the end of the dive. Cray numbers were low though with only Craydrian bringing back two keepers.



After a very short move to The Maze (still on Roe Reef), it was time for Skipper Steve and DO Bernie to go for a quick explore during the surface interval. Despite leaving his wetsuit in the car and wearing only his boardies and a rashie for warmth, Steve went in anyway.
